In the fall of 2013 Lori Richards expressed a desire to be able to help the 2 Nez Perce youth horse groups who bring youth to the Chief Joseph Ride. There are scholarships for some of the youth to be able to go, but Lori had a real desire to provide more. Lori wondered if my good friend, artist Susan Hartenhoff, would be interested in painting a picture that we could raffle off to raise money. Sue agreed to do a painting, and after many hours of thought and research the *Nez Perce Women* was on a 24X 36 canvas. South Dakota Horseperson of the Year Awards

The CON ApHC is proud that four of its past and current members have been recipients of the South Dakota Horseperson of the Year award. Bob Reed won the award in 1995, Gene Carr in 2004, Danny Bennett in 2000, and Doug Nickel in 2005. Congratulations!

Bob Reed, who passed away in 2006, was an early member of the club and contributed greatly to its strong foundation, growth and successes. Bob was a breeder and exhibitor of appaloosa horses for many years, and he was well-known to horse enthusiasts for his role as Horse Superintendent of the South Dakota Horse Fair. He was a noted horseman, and he served as an outrider for the entire South Dakota Centennial Wagon Train that traveled much of the state during May 10, 1989 - September 4, 1989 to commemorate the statehood centennial. Bob was awarded the Heartland Saddle Award which honors people who have contributed socially, economically and culturally to the betterment of South Dakota with an emphasis on youth work.

Danny Bennett, whose membership in the CON ApHC began as a youth, has provided leadership and service in many ways to the club. He and other members of his family have been found in the show ring and rodeo arena with their appaloosa horses, and he has raised a number of championship horses. In 2013, he was recognized with the Non-Pro Sportsmanship Award at the 2013 National Appaloosa Horse Show.

Gene Carr was also a very early member of the CON ApHC, joining very soon after the club was chartered in the 1960's. Not only has he impacted the regional club, he served for a number of years as a national ApHC Director. He is renowned for his knowledge of horse pedigrees and is a long-time breeder of Appaloosa and POA horses. Gene is an approved judge for ten associations and has judged horse shows throughout the US and internationally.

Doug Nickel is a familiar face to many in the horse industry in South Dakota, whether appaloosa or any other breed. He has been an instrumental part of many activities and events within the state, including serving as a leader for several years in the South Dakota Horse Council and assisting with the management for events such the South Dakota Horse Fair, the Sioux Empire Fair, and the South Dakota State Fair. Doug has worked as an announcer at a number of 4-H, open, and breed shows and collegiate equine competitions. He and his family members can be found using their appaloosa horses in a variety of events from time to time, including participating in team ropings, horse shows, and mounted shooting contests.
